Each visitor will leave the attraction with his own comic strip page, focusing on his favorite strip character.







THE ART OF LAW

GROENINGEMUSEUM 28 October 2016 – 5 February 2017

In 1494, Gerard David was commissioned by the city council of Bruges to paint 'the Judgement of

Cambyses'. This dramatic and gruesome work once hung in the court chamber of Bruges town

hall, as an example of how justice must be served. now it is one to the most important paintings in

the collection of the Groeningemuseum. From the 15th century onwards, it was common practice for courtrooms to be decorated with scenes that in some way alluded to justice. 'The Last Judgement' – the ultimate moment of divine justice – was frequently chosen for this purpose. 'The Last Judgement' was also painted in the council chamber in Bruges, amongst others by Jan Provoost and Pieter Pourbus. In addition, other appropriate subjects from sacred and profane literature were likewise used to represent the 'justice theme' in places where justice was administered. These were usually specific examples of the 'fair' implementation of justice – the so-called 'exempla iustitiae' – such as the story of Cambyses, which became very popular in the 16th century. Subjects relating to justice were also often depicted in works of art intended for non-legal settings. At one time or another justice, executions, judges and condemned prisoners have all inspired

artists to create paintings, engravings, drawings, sculptures and stained glass.

This exhibition is built around thirty or so works from their own collections. Together with more

than 60 works lent from other galleries and museums.

ANIMA ETERNA BRUGES

<u>3 March 2017</u>

Where jazz and classical meet, there reigns George Gershwin. As a young composer of music hall and Broadway songs, Gershwin broke through in 1924 with Rhapsody in Blue, a perfect marriage of symphonic style and the rhythmic energy of jazz. Classical music clearly attracted Gershwin: just listen to An American in Paris or his opera Porgy and Bess, both of which are brimming with brilliant melodies. In this programme the almost 30year-old Anima Eterna Brugge take their very first steps into jazz. And they do so in excellent company. Pianist Bart Van Caenegem, who earned his spurs in both genres, will be playing an appropriate piano - an early Steinway & Sons. And the concert's 'leading lady' is one of Anima's favourite female singers: American soprano Claron McFadden, who besides technique and expressiveness, also has the mettle and panache of a born entertainer.



DOMAIN ALEXEI LUBIMOV

21-23 April 2017

Small in stature, iron-fingered, but with velvet touch and an eagle-eyed perception of the hidden depths of a score, that's Russian pianist Alexei Lubimov in a nutshell. Domain Alexei Lubimov highlights three facets of this versatile pianist: his crystal-clear articulation and unerring sense of style in the Viennese classics, his flair for the interplay of tradition and innovation in Debussy and Stravinsky, and his great commitment to the music of his homeland, both old and new.

BUDAPEST FESTIVAL

CONCERT BUILDING BRUGES 18-20 May 2017

Iván Fischer and his Budapest Festival Orchestra are world renowned for their vibrant, extremely precise and 'authentically Hungarian' performances of the music of their compatriot Béla Bartók. It is still hard to find a better performance of Bartók's Concerto for Orchestra than the BFO's. It's no wonder then that in this fourth edition of the Budapest Festival they are focussing on the music of the Hungarian master. Even today the vitality of Bartók's music - its wild tempestuousness, brutal vehemence and emotional depth - continues to inspire musicians and audiences. Thanks to its stratification, diversity, popularity, complexity and simultaneously Hungarian, European and cosmopolitan character, Bartók remains a very relevant composer. Perhaps the greatest of the 20th century? This fourth edition of the Budapest Festival focusses on Bartók's three main stage works: Duke Bluebeard's Castle, The Wooden Prince and The Miraculous Mandarin. Attending a concert by the Budapest Festival Orchestra is like experiencing the re-creation of music with your own eyes and ears. Fischer always provides that 'little something extra' that sets extraordinary orchestras apart from the simply good. HOLY BLOOD PROCESSION

DIFFERENT LOCATIONS 25 May 2017

The Procession of the Holy Blood, that dates back to at least 1303, takes place in Bruges every

year on Ascension Day. Although there have been many changes over the centuries, the heart of the event is the reenactment of the passion and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

For as long as anyone can remember, the pageant has been divided into four parts. Legend has it that in 1150, after the second Crusade, Thierry d'Alsace, Count of Flanders, brought the relic of the Holy Blood of Jesus back from Jerusalem, to be placed in the Basilica on the Burg. What we know for sure is that the legend contains several elements of popular belief and folklore. The Procession of the Holy Blood was added to the representative list of intangible cultural heritage of humanity (2009).

Memling in Context. a fresh look at Hans memling's paintings of the st-Janshospitaal

SINT – JANS HOSPITAAL <u>11 May – 8 October 2017</u>

"The collection of St. John's Hospital (Sint-Janshospitaal) in Bruges is crucial for our understanding of the works produced by one of the greatest European masters of the 15th century: Hans Memling (c.1435-1494). It is there that Memling's only surviving signed and dated altarpieces can be found. Actually ordered for the hospital and completed in 1479, inscriptions on the still-original frames cite Memling as their creator. These two altarpieces, regarded as the touchstones for the reconstruction of an extraordinary rich oeuvre, will be presented with the important ensemble of Memling's other works at Sint-Janshospitaal. The exhibition is based on scientific research (including the interpretation of recently executed infrared refl ectography, which reveal the underdrawings) and presents the paintings in their new installation at the museum premises. Special emphasis is put on the history of Memling's paintings, which after 1839 formed the core collection of one of the earliest museums and major tourist attractions in Belgium: the Memling Museum."

Organized around the themes of trauma and healing, the show takes as its centerpiece Kentridge's 2015 video installation 'More Sweetly Play the Dance', a contemporary interpretation of a medieval Dance of Death. This ambitious procession – a form to which he returns, like Rembrandt to selfportraits – reveals a conscience deeply embedded in historical traumas: colonial Africa, the Holocaust, apartheid. Through the combination of setting and displayed works, including several by Flemish Primitive and modern artists, the exhibition presents art as a powerful means of "working

through" layers of history and mending ruptures in collective self-identity

POL BURY - RETROSPECTIVE

BOZAR 24 February – 4 June 2017

Pol Bury (La Louvière, 1922 - Paris, 2005) was a Belgian painter, sculptor, jewellery designer, writer and graphic artist. He started out as a painter under the influence of René Magritte and Yves Tanguy, painting until after World War II in a Surrealistic style. Later, Bury exhibited with the Jeune Peinture Belge group and the Cobra movement, but around 1953 became fascinated by contemporary sculpture, inspired by Alexander Calder. He went on to produce his first 'moving' works, driven by a motor, and became one of the protagonists of kineticart. Characteristic of his work is the extreme slowness of the often unpredictable movements that take place in his sculptures and objects.

The retrospective exhibition at the Centre for Fine Arts will provide a deeper insight into the diversity and complexity of Pol Bury's work, while revealing the common thread that runs through it.





Tongeren, the oldest town in Belgium, is proud to be the cradle of Christianity in the Low Countries. As the oldest Maria resort on this side of the Alps pilgrimages were already organized in the Middle Ages and until the French Revolution, after which they were banned. When in 1890 the Pope gave permission to crown the miraculous image of Our Lady "Cause of Our Joy", the Tongeren population decided to transform the pilgrimage into seven annual Coronation Celebrations. This tradition is kept alive to this day and is also included in the Flemish inventory for Intangible Cultural Heritage. In 2017, the Celebrations is organized for the nineteenth time.
